## Introduction to What-if Functions (4-Year UG Programs)

#### **Abstract**

The What-If Report is a tool that can be used by 4Y undergraduate students to determine how changes to their major or minor programs would affect their course of study. For students who are not familiar with the Academic Advisement Report, please firstly refer to the information in "Introduction to Advisement Report".

Similar as advisement requirement in Student Center, the online what-if report provides simulated information on student's study progress based on the courses taken; it also simulates scenarios with courses students planned to take, or new major or minor programs planned to add or change to.

#### Where to access What-if Report

- Students may login to Student Center via the SIS website (<a href="http://arr.ust.hk/sis/student">http://arr.ust.hk/sis/student</a>) or
  HKUST Portal (<a href="http://my.ust.hk">http://my.ust.hk</a>). The What-If Report is a tool that can be used by 4Y
  undergraduate students to determine how changes to their major or minor programs would
  affect their course of study
- 2. In Student Center, there are 2 methods to access what-if Report,

#### Method 1:

In Academics section, select the item "What-if Report" from the pull-down menu and click the ">>" button to access What-if Report Selection.

#### Method 2:




Figure 1 – Access the Report from "Academics" section

In the same section, click "My Academics" item (Figure 1) and select the item "Create a What-if scenario" on the right-handed menu (Figure 2).




Figure 3 - Create a new what-if report; vs. Browse the last what-if report created

3. In What-if Report Selection, students can either create a new what-if report by selecting the green button "Create new Report" or clicking the hyperlink to browse the <u>last report created</u> (Figure 3).

#### **Create What-if Scenarios**

Create What-if Scenario

4. There are 3 sections in what-if scenarios: Career Scenario, Program Scenario and Course Scenarios.

The current Career, Academic Program, Plan (Area of Study) of the student are firstly displayed as default values (Figure 4).

In order to generate a meaningful what-if report, a valid combination of Program, Area of Study and Concentration must be selected in a logical way (please refer to <a href="Program Scenario">Program Scenario</a> section below for details).

#### You may be thinking of changing your program of study or taking certain courses. Using this page, you can set up a what-if scenario based on different academic programs or courses. #### 5. Career Scenario

a. Only Career Scenario = Undergraduate can be selected.

Select a career and then select the term for which you want the change to take place.




Figure 6a – 4Y Programs will be displayed with suffix 4 in their description

#### 6. Program Scenario

a. **Academic Programs** is a combination of Degree and School. As all 3Y and 4Y UG academic programs will be displayed; and 4Y programs can be differentiated by the suffix "4Y" (Figure 6a). Student should only choose one of the following Academic Programs:

Bachelor of Business Admin: 4Y

o Bachelor of Engineering: 4Y

Bachelor of Science (IPO): 4Y

o Bachelor of Science (SBM): 4Y

Bachelor of Science (SENG): 4Y

o Bachelor of Science (SSCI): 4Y

Bachelor of Science (SHSS): 4Y

Dual Degree: 4Y

#### **Program Scenario**

The information that appears on the page by default is your current academic information. You can use the fields below to set up a what-if scenario based on one or more programs of study. You can define up to three scenarios.

b. **Area of Study** (also known as **Academic Plan**): It refers to major, major with track and minor in 4Y UG curriculum. Students should put the primary major on the first line, followed by other major and then minors; and only the additional major(s) and minor(s) eligible for the corresponding Academic Program shall be selected.

Students should only choose Area of Study with suffix "4Y" corresponding to the Academic Program selected. For details please refer to <u>Valid Program Scenarios</u> (Combination of UG Program / Plan) section below.

#### **Program Scenario**

The information that appears on the page by default is your current academic information. You can use the fields below to set up a what-if scenario based on one or more programs of study. You can define up to three scenarios.




Figure 6b –In this example, 4Y Academic Programs and Plans are selected




Figure 6c – 2 Concentration (Options) will be displayed when BSc (RMBI) is selected

c. **Concentration** (also known as **Academic Sub-Plan**): It refers to the Options within a particular major; only the relevant Options will be displayed after the respective major is selected in Area of Study (Figure 6c).

#### Program Scenario

The information that appears on the page by default is your current academic information. You can use the fields below to set up a what-if scenario based on one or more programs of study. You can define up to three scenarios.




Figure 7a – Selecting courses for what-if report

#### 7. Course Scenario

a. Additional courses intended to take can be added here, and they will be included in the what-if report. Students are advised to read the course details before adding into the simulation (Figure 7a).




Figure 7b – Specify the planned term of study when selecting what-if courses

b. Students may specify the term (enrollment term) after selecting the course (Figure 7b).

8. Finally, students shall submit the request to generate a What-if Report by clicking the green button "SUMBIT REQUEST".



#### **Interpretation of What-if Report**




Figure 8 – In this example, ACCT 2010 is a What-if Course and marked with "?" in the Status column

9. The What-if Report looks like an Advisement Report, all What-If Courses will be marked with"?" to differentiate from Taken or In progress Courses. In this report, students can find the curriculum requirements and check whether what-if courses have been used to fulfill the requirements (Figure 8).

#### Important Information on the What-if Report

- The what-if report is only a report provides simulated information on student's study progress based on courses that they have taken and planned to take, and major or minor programs planned to add or change. Same as advisement report, there may be certain requirements which cannot be set up by system logics and some technical constraints which may affect the accuracy of the report. As such, students should NOT solely rely on the what-if report for enrolment or program requirement fulfilling purposes and are strongly advised to consult the academic advisors regularly for academic advice. Students should also refer to the <a href="Program Catalog for 4-Year UG">Program UG</a> regularly for the latest updates.




Figure 9 – Invalid report consist of 4Y Engineering program and 3Y CEEV major plan

- > Students must select valid combinations of Academic Programs and Plans (Area of Study). Handicapped what-if reports may be shown if invalid academic program/plan combinations are selected (e.g. in a mixture of 3Y and 4Y program / plans in Figure 9).

#### Program Scenario

The information that appears on the page by default is your current academic information. You can use the fields below to set up a what-if scenario based on one or more programs of study. You can define up to three scenarios.




Figure 10 – Suffix "4Y" will be attached in 4Y Programs and Plans

➤ 3Y and 4Y programs / plans in Program Scenario can be distinguished by the suffix; as all 4Y Academic Program and Plans can be differentiated by the suffix "4Y" (Figure 10).

- Maximum of 3 rows in program scenarios could be included and simulated in What-if Report. If multiple rows are used, the same Academic Program must be selected in each row.
- > There is no limitation on number of courses to be included in courses scenario; students should note that duplicated courses included in what-if scenarios may produce handicap what-if report and affect the accuracy of the simulation results.
