


### **University Common Core Requirement (4Y)**

It is not uncommon that most of the courses enrolled in the first term of study will be used to fulfill the University Common Core Requirements.



### **Area A: English Communication**

The 6 credit units of English Communication will usually be fulfilled by LANG 1002A/S (in Fall term) and LANG 1003 (in Spring term).





Students with English Communications transfer credits will have this requirement fulfilled like the picture below.



### **Area B: Chinese Communication**

It is required to select 3 credit units (usually a course) of Chinese Communication from the Common Core course list to fulfill this requirement.





### **Area C: Quantitative Reasoning (QR)**

Students shall select 3 credit units from the QR courses available. Detailed course list can be found in UCE website (<a href="http://uce.ust.hk">http://uce.ust.hk</a>).



### **Area D: Science and Technology (S&T)**


The system will automatically try to match the enrolled courses to the requirements. In this case, LIFS 1030 is in the S&T SSC course list, and hence the requirement on 3 credit units S&T SSC is satisfied. This student is required to select another course (3 credit units) from the S&T course list.





### **Area E: Social Analysis (SA)**


In this example, SOSC 1350 is in the SA SSC course list. Therefore, the SA SSC requirement has been satisfied. The student shall select another 3 credit units SA common core course list. All SA SSC courses can also be found in the SA course list. Please also note that SOSC 1350 is also a required course in SHSS School requirements. The system allows maximum 6 credit units to be reused to fulfill both SHSS School and University Common Core requirements.





### **Area F: Humanities (H)**


In this example, the requirements in the Humanities area have been partially satisfied. The student shall choose a (3 credit unit) course from Humanities SSC course list to fulfill the requirement.





### Area G: Core Elective (Arts / H / QR / SA / S&T)

Enrolled common core courses (other than Arts) will be used to fulfill specific requirements in other areas first. After those requirements are satisfied, excess credit units enrolled (taken) will be used to fulfill the Core Elective requirement.



### **Area H: Healthy Lifestyle**

HLTH 1010 is a required course for the first year of study. Students are required to fulfill the detailed course requirements in BOTH Fall and Spring term. For further details, please refer to Student Affairs Office (SAO).



Students are expected to complete 12 credits in English language - six credits through required English courses in the University Common Core, and another six through courses approved for the English language requirement.

In addition to the requirements of their major programs, students are required to complete the School Requirements as shown below.

Some courses can be used to fulfill both School Requirements and University Common Core Requirements. Students may reuse a maximum of 6 credits of these courses to count towards both Requirements.

Unless approved by the Dean or the Dean's designate, students are not allowed to reuse courses included in the School Requirements to fulfill the major requirements.


Students are required to complete courses in the following areas.

Student may opt to graduate with or without an option. Students who take an option MUST complete all requirements specified in addition to the major requirements.


### **Required Course**

### **HUMA / SOSC Restricted Elective**

This requirement only validate whether 6 courses and 18 credit units have been taken from the course lists in four areas. It should be considered together with the following two verification requirements follow.

This requirement verifies that among the 6 courses taken, there are three 3000-level and three 4000-level courses.



### **HUMA/SOSC/SHSS Elective (For opting SHSS 4991)**

It is not uncommon that students found the HUMA and SOSC common core courses taken reflected in this and the next requirements (i.e. SHSS 4991 / SHSS 4992); as the system will try to fulfill these major requirements as much as possible before fulfilling the Common Core requirements.

The student here studied more than 3 courses in this category but only 3 of them are selected to fulfill this requirement, because all of them are not 3000 / 4000-level courses. The student shall choose three more 3000 / 4000-level courses to fulfill this requirement.





The system picks up the eligible courses with the best results from the enrollment list to fulfill the requirements.



Note: HUMA1000 is selected by the system to fulfill the major elective requirement. Upon graduation, students may request to use particular courses to fulfill particular requirements as long as it will improve the graduation progress and/or status.



### **HUMA/SOSC/SHSS Elective (For opting SHSS 4992)**

Here is another option to fulfill the requirement. Upon selection of SHSS 4991 or SHSS 4992, these two options will then be rectified accordingly to reflect the final requirement and the respective status.



Three courses (9 credit units) were taken (or being taken). The student shall choose other two 3000 to 4000-level courses from the GCS Elective: 3000-4000 Level course list, if this option is preferred (opting SHSS 4992).
